Perfect for experienced practitioners who work directly with men using family violence (one on one, group work or case management) in specialist family violence, AOD, mental health and child protection sectors, this training is designed to refresh and upskill practitioners in deescalation techniques to reduce harm. The Five Essential Tools are drawn from the experience of specialist work in MBC programs and have been packaged in a way that assists practitioners to engage men in meaningful conversations.

The tools include specialist engagement and holding strategies specific to working with men using family violence, and uniquely applies these tools to face to face, telephone and online responses to men using family violence.

This three-hour interactive training session is presented by NTV Trainer Stacy Oehlman

Stacy is a Queensland-based Social Worker with over 15 years' frontline experience. Stacy has worked within child protection and domestic and family violence in both government and nongovernment agencies, across roles including policy, service delivery, risk assessment, risk management, training, and community engagement.
